PUBLIC HEARING NOVEMBER 12, 2019 GALWAY TOWN HALL

Supervisor Smith called the Public Hearing to order at 6:30 p.m. The following Town Board Members were present:

Councilman Ryan Flinton arrived late at 6:39 p.m.

OTHERS PRESENT: P. Keeler, B. Merchant & M. DeFoe, Town Clerk.

Town Clerk stated legal notice was placed in Daily Gazette on October 12, 2019 and posted at Town Hall; Library; Post Office, Bank & Town Website advising the public of a Public Hearing to review and approve the 2020 Preliminary Budget to be held on November 12, 2019 at 6:30 p.m. Pursuant to Section 108 of the Town Law, the proposed salaries of the following Town Officers are hereby specified: Supervisor - \$25,000; Council Members (4) – each at \$5,100; with Deputy Supervisor an additional \$200; Town Clerk - \$35,000; 1st Justice - \$10,200; 2nd Justice - \$10,200; Superintendent of Highways - \$67,400. Supervisor Smith stated there were a couple of minor changes to preliminary budget. The 1st page with reference to Harmony Corners Fire District the correct amount is \$18,384; Mortgage Tax anticipated revenue is being lowered to \$80,648; correction of 2% salary increase which was omitted for Deputy Tax Collector & Assessor; DA1120 Non Prop. Tax from County was increased from \$400,000 to \$430,000; DB1120 Non Prop. Tax from County was increased from \$495,000 to \$499,930. Supervisor Smith asked if there were any questions or comments from audience regarding the 2020 budget. There were none, Board kept public hearing open in case anyone came late and wanted to comment on budget. There were no further questions from audience and no written communications was received regarding proposed budget. Councilman Fred Arnold made a motion, seconded by Councilman Rod Wilday to close the Public Hearing on 2020 Proposed Budget at 6:40 p.m. **MOTION CARRIED** All aves.

Supervisor Smith called the Meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The same Town Board Members were present. Audience – In addition to Public Hearing: B. Jones; J. Trainor, Planning/ZBA Attorney; D. Costanzo, Highway Superintendent; C. & D. Schweizer; Chet; T. Gilday, Building Administrator & M. DeFoe, Town Clerk.

Arnold; Legal Notice placed in Daily Gazette on 10/1/19 advising public of Economic Development Meeting held at Town Hall on 10/23/19 at 7:00 p.m.; Final Harmony Corners Fire District Budget \$18,382.50; Notification from TJA Clean Energy letter of content to construct a solar energy system at 1806 Perth Road; Thank you letter from Friends of Galway Public Library for use of building for their monthly meetings, now that Library is completed they will no longer need to use Town Hall on the third Tuesday of each month & Resolution is needed to adopt Town Health Insurance Plan.

COMMITTEE/DEPARTMENT HEAD/LIAISON REPORT: Historian - Phyllis Keeler stated that she was asked when Galway became a Town. She researched this and found that Galway became a Town on March 17, 1792. The question then came up, how many acres are in the Town of Galway. Phyllis stated that there are 27,805 acres of land in the Town of Galway. Phyllis got a call from the Vermont TV station requesting another interview with her where they discussed the devastating village fire of September 17, 1908. Documentary will run sometime in early spring. Phyllis has been working with Darby Knizek as she would like to learn duties of being a Historian in hopes of taking over for Phyllis when she retires. Phyllis reiterated that she is not looking any time in near future to retire. Gazette article honoring her was wonderful, she thanked the Town Board for the celebration they have planned for her. Phyllis will be honored for 50 years of Historian services for the Town of Galway at the High School Auditorium at 7 p.m. Wednesday night. Highway - Dave stated for October the Highway Department hopefully has moved the ballfield and Town Hall for the last time this season; did work on shoulders on Hudson Road; Alexander Road; Graves Road; Barkersville Road; Greens Corners Road & Mechanic Street some of these roads were paved and some were cleanup of washouts; helped out Charlton; Ballston; Greenfield & Milton; did ditching on Birchton Road; Parkis Mills Road; Cruthers Road & Welch Road; worked on leaves at cemetery, Town of Milton will come with their big vacuum to suck leaves up; worked on a parking area on Silcox Road for trail system to get parked cars off road. For November they hope to screen sand and bring to shop; a lot of clean-up is still needed after Halloween storm, man hours have been submitted to county for possible FEMA funding; Supervisor Smith stated that on trail grants county wide will be funded thru county; Town Clerk questioned if Supervisor had discussed with Saratoga Plan the promotion of the trail system as many residents are unaware of them as indicated in recent survey's. Supervisor Smith stated that he felt they would be working on that as will Planning Department at County. He believes county will be putting a press release out regarding trail system. Supervisor Smith would like to add trail maps to Town website. Highway is looking for resolution for truck purchase, Highway Superintendent has ordered truck which is in budget financing needs to be determined; Dave's suggestion would be for the three-year option. Bad year for parts currently over \$6,635 budgeted amount, Supervisor Smith suggesting the continuation of addressing short fall with contingency. Sand & salt should be ok will keep monitoring.
