Bulk Waste Drop Off Spring 2018

The Town of Galway will be conducting a bulk waste drop-off program for town residents May 22nd through May 25th and again June 5th through June 8th at the Town Highway Garage at 5910 Sacandaga Road (NYS Rte. 147).

Drop off times for each are 6:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m.

There will be highway employees assigned to this duty, please see them before dropping off your waste so that they can direct you to the proper location.

The following items will **NOT** be accepted:

- No Electronics
- No Hazardous Materials
 - o Paints, paint thinners, petroleum products (oil/gas), etc.
- No Household Garbage
- No Propane Tanks
- No Tires
- Metal will be accepted as well as refrigerators and freezers but they <u>MUST be drained of</u> refrigerants.

The Town will be running a bulk waste drop-off at the Highway Department located at the Town Hall Complex on Route 147. There will be highway employees assigned to this duty, please see them before dropping off your waste so that they can direct you to the proper location. Following are the dates and times for the drop-off:

NEWS FROM THE ASSESSOR

As you are all aware, the Assessor's Office has begun the process for a revaluation project in the Town. A public information meeting was held on February 28th at which time information about the ramifications and process of such project were explained. It was explained that the purpose for this project is to regain equity in the Town and make sure all property owners are paying their fair share of taxes. **It is NOT to raise more tax money!**!

The first step in this project will be to send out Data Mailers to all property owners (excepting vacant land owners) in May. Once you receive this information, please review it, make any corrections necessary and return to my office by the deadline (June 15, 2018). Once this information has been input, field review will begin. Field review will happen during July-September. When I am in the field, I will be in a car that is clearly identified as the Town of Galway Assessor. We will be checking data and updating pictures as necessary.

This project will not affect taxes until school taxes in September 2019 and Town/County taxes of 2020. There will be ample time for discussion with this office if you feel your information is not correct.


Galway Preservation Society
