Honoring our Veterans

In honor of our Veterans, the Galway Veterans Committee is constructing a Veterans' Memorial Park where family, friends, and town residents can honor our Veterans who have served and sacrificed in all branches of the United States Military.



The park will be built by the revenue from a buy a brick fundraiser and a grant from the Saratoga County Veterans- Saratoga County Board of Supervisors.

The bricks are 8x8 and cost \$100. Lettering and spacing are included, can be up to 20 spaces, that is, 5 to 6 lines based on if clipart is incorporated. One choice of clipart is included. Choices will be provided for selection. Benches with an engraved bronze plague are also available.

The park will be in front of the Galway Town Hall around the existing flagpole and memorial stone.

There are also two gaming opportunities for older teens and young adults held each month – board games at the library and video online gaming held in a secure "room."


