# **Highway Department**

The department is currently working on cleaning up the damage from April's winter storm. Our brush chipper is presently down for repair; once it is up and running, we will be continuing the clean-up around town.

We are currently sweeping the roads town-wide of the sand put down during our winter maintenance season, as well as fixing wing cuts. Once the roads have been cleared and the warmer season progresses, our crews will begin roadside mowing as time and weather permits. Please slow down when coming upon our employees and mowers for their safety as well as yours.

The construction season will get underway sometime in May. The department will be working on a total reconstruction of Crane Road from the intersection of CR45 to Donnan Road. We also plan to work on reconstruction of certain sections of Parkis Mills Road. Please note the road construction plans can and will be adjusted based upon time and projected funds available at any given time.

Please remember that there is mulch available to town residents at the Town Hall Complex. The pile is located on the right-hand side before the gate to the Highway Department. Any stone or sand materials that are in the gated area are off-limits and are meant for highway construction.

Bulk waste drop-off will not be taking place in the Spring this year however, there is one being planned for the Fall.

# **Building Inspector/ Zoning Enforcement**

As of January 1st, all plans submitted for a building permit must be 11" x 17" Single-sided. Plans of this size take up much less space when filing and allow us to scan them in-house. This is one more step in reducing the paper usage of this office. Commercial Plans and Surveys are exempt from this.

#### Happy Spring from Galway Public Library




