REGULAR MEETING SEPTEMBER 12, 2017 GALWAY TOWN HALL

Supervisor Lent called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. The following Town Board Members were present:

A motion was made by Councilman Arnold seconded by Councilman Smith to approve the minutes of the August 8, 2017 Regular Meeting as submitted.

MOTION CARRIED

Reports- Phyllis Keeler, Historian advised that the people of Galway are making history. Galway Emergency Medical Service had an open house on September 9th celebrating 50 years of service to the community. Phyllis worked with them regarding that history. September 11th a Historical Marker was placed at the home of Mike and Alyson Bingham on Jockey Street honoring the "Seabury Family". Phyllis also participated in a celebration on September 9th honoring Pastor, Wayne Brandow for his 40 years of service to the Bible Baptist Church.

<u>Communications</u> – Town Clerk stated Board Members received copies of the following correspondence: NYSLRS employer e-news for August; Budget Amendments; Speed limit reduction request for Ridge Road; Assessor Report for September; re-appoint needed for Carol Hynes to Board of Assessment Review; Yearly approval for the Ainsley's Angels of America 5k run to be held on April 28th 2018 & Highway Report for August with schedule for September.

Councilman Smith stated that when working on Code updating we may want to streamline some of the requirement in Lake District, most lots can't do too much without the need for a variance. Supervisor Lent stated that he has Code/Comprehensive Plan on his list of things to look into during budget process. Highway – Dave Costanzo, Highway Superintendent stated for August they cut overhead on Ridge Road & Hermance Road; ditched and paved catch basins on Ridge Road; replaced cross-culverts on Jersey Hill & Parkis Mills Road; paved with Ballston, Charlton, Halfmoon & County and mowed Town Hall and ballfield. Schedule for September: Pave Ridge Road from Crooked Street to Lake Road; mow the Town Hall, ROW's and ballfields; cut overhead

brush. Councilman Smith discussed beaver issues with Superintendent. Youth Commission – Donna Sowle stated that fall soccer started on the 9th sign-up going well; karate will return to inside school building on Tuesday & Thursday's; Rifle Club started last week; Donna stated that she completed her budget request only concern is wage increase for summer recreation. Highway – Dave stated that he forgot to talk about bulk waste drop off, did the Board want to hold another before the end of year. Dave suggested holding it for two weeks at the end of October. Board felt it was a good idea. Supervisor Lent stated that Dave just needed to give him the dates and he would put it up on website. Newsletter will go out in October, that would be great to have in newsletter.

Councilman Arnold made a motion, seconded by Councilman Smith to approve the General Abstract of Vouchers (A) dated 08/01/17 thru 08/31/17 for a total of \$61,835.90.

Supervisor Lent stated that year over year sales tax is up about 6.5%; mortgage receipt tax up about \$2,800 year over year. Health insurance rates for 2018 will only increase 4.3%. Winter FEMA was approved in . March but with disasters in Texas and Florida funding will probably not reach Town for

several years.

On a motion of Councilman Smith, seconded by Councilman Wilday the following resolution was ADOPTED: AYES – 5 NAYS – 0

RESOLVED that the Galway Town Board schedule a Public Hearing for October 10, 2017 at 6:45 p.m. to review Proposed Local Law #: 2 of 2017 which would allow the Town Board to override the tax levy limit established in General Municipal Law 3-C. All ayes.

Supervisor Lent stated that he applied for a \$100,000 grant to update and enhance snow removal capabilities. Issue is money is paid after the purchase. Obviously, there is not \$225,000 in capital account. Application to dormitory authority states we didn't plan on this purchase. We will make purchase on a payment plan when funding is received from grant Town Board will apply it to principal reducing cost of truck. They seemed to be ok with this arrangement.

Privilege of the Floor

Mary Cuffe-Perez and Bill Bateman both residents of Hermance Road voiced their displeasure with the way the Highway Superintendent is cutting the trees back on the right-of-way on Hermance Road. Would like to see the guidelines used for this type of cutting. Dave Costanzo stated that he was willing to work with both of them on the cutting. Will call tomorrow to set-up a meeting with both of them to try and reach a balance on what needs to be cut. Councilman Arnold went over the damage that occurs on road due to canopy tree coverage, giving a section of Charlton Road as an example. Supervisor Lent stated that New York State Department of Transportation would be the experts on this subject. If you go to their website under the section having to do with policy & procedures there is an entire section that goes over tree trimming. Supervisor Lent stated that road liability, safety and aesthetics have to reach a balance. Dave Costanzo stated that the maximum height for a truck is 13'9"; that has to be considered when cutting trees. Those trucks need to be able to travel safely on the roadway. Bill **Bateman** went into discussion regarding the terrible attempt made by the Highway Department last year to pave Hermance from Greens Corners Road to Sacandaga Road. Highway Superintendent Costanzo stated that a top coat will be put on that section of road but not this year. That section of road was in terrible condition with pot holes and cracks, they shimmed road in preparation of top coat. Supervisor Lent stated that was his error in telling him last month that road was going to be paved this year.

Councilman Arnold made a motion, seconded by Councilwoman Grant to adjourn the meeting at 8:05 p.m.
